

VENUE FLOORPLANS


FIBES II General floor plan



FIBES II, Level 3




FIBES II, Level 2

Important Note to Healthcare and Non-Healthcare Professionals

Definition

According to the European Union Directive 2001/83 /EC (and amended version 2010/84/EU), the promotion of prescription-only medicines should be directed solely at Healthcare Professionals or any person who is authorised to prescribe, use or handle them.

As a multidisciplinary audience will attend the EADV Symposium, EADV will assign the delegates the category of Healthcare Professionals (HCP) or Non-Healthcare Professionals (Non-HCP) to ensure compliance with the regulations.

The Code of Practice for the Pharmaceutical Industry (2021) states the following:

Healthcare Professionals: Any member of the medical, dental, pharmaceutical, nursing, or podiatric profession, any other person legally considered as such, or any other person who, in exercising their profession, may perform or participate in the prescription, purchase, supply, dispensation or administration of medicinal products for human use.

For the purpose of this Code, veterinarians are excluded from this concept.

Sections of the code that are also relevant to the Symposium:

"4.4. All material related to medicines and their uses which is sponsored by a pharmaceutical company must clearly indicate the sponsor."

Industry Sessions and Advertising

Satellite Symposia and Industry Expert Hub Sessions presenting data on the development, research or other issues related to prescription medicine can be restricted to Healthcare Professionals and Industry Participants only upon indication provided by the Industry Session Organizer. All promotional materials and marketing aids related to these industry sessions should be strictly limited to HCPs only.

Industry Session organisers could limit participation to certain representative groups independently from EADV's recommendations if deemed imperative to the achievement of the intended purpose of the Industry session. The organising company reserves the right to refuse single categories, in particular, if not adequately related to the objective and purpose of the session.

HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONAL INFORMATION AND DEFINITION

The industry session organiser is responsible for the compliance of the session.

Other categories

STUDENTS are NOT considered Healthcare Professionals under the current guidelines and will be automatically classified as **Non-Healthcare Professionals**.

The full EADV Scientific Programme, e-Poster Area and Industry sessions organised by companies producing over-the-counter (OTC) products and similar sessions will be open to all participants.
